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For a sequence to be included in a WIPO ST.26-compliant sequence listing it must meet the minimum length requirement. See [WIPO ST.26](#) paragraph 8. If you import an ST.25-compliant sequence listing into WIPO Sequence, this sequence will appear as 'intentionally skipped'.

The advice provided in Scenario 3 of Annex VII of WIPO ST.26, which provides recommendations on how to avoid added or deleted matter, is to include the excluded sequences in the application body.
